*1 Who has believed what we have heard?
And who has the arm of the Lord been revealed to?*

*2 He grew up before Him like a young plant
and like a root out of dry ground.*

*He didn't have an impressive form
or majesty that we should look at Him,
no appearance that we should desire Him.*

*3 He was despised and rejected by men,
a man of suffering who knew what sickness was.
He was like someone people turned away from;*

He was despised, and we didn't value Him. ~ Isaiah 53:1-3

*4 Yet He Himself bore our sicknesses,
and He carried our pains;*

*but we in turn regarded Him stricken,
struck down by God, and afflicted.*

*5 But He was pierced because of our transgressions,
crushed because of our iniquities;
punishment for our peace was on Him,
and we are healed by His wounds. ~ Isaiah 53:4-5*

and who considered His fate?
For He was cut off from the land of the living;
He was struck because of my people's rebellion.
9 They made His grave with the wicked
and with a rich man at His death,
although He had done no violence
and had not spoken deceitfully.
10 Yet the Lord was pleased to crush Him severely.
When You make Him a restitution offering,
He will see His seed, He will prolong His days,
and by His hand, the Lord's pleasure will be accomplished ~ Isaiah 53:6-10*
